



## GRIPF Study

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Trial title	Genetic research in Idiopathic Pulmonary Fibrosis (GRIPF)
Trial synopsis	<p>We are seeking suitable participants for a research study that examines how genetic factors may contribute to Pulmonary Fibrosis (PF), a rare but severe lung disease. In this study, we are interested in people with PF who have a family history of PF or ILD. Additionally, if families with multiple people with PF are willing to participate, we would be interested in both the relatives with and without PF as this will allow us to look at genetic similarities and differences between the family members.</p> <p>This national research project is being carried out by a team of researchers from the Menzies Institute for Medical Research, University of Tasmania in collaboration with the Australian IPF Registry. Both the Registry and this study are facilitated by Lung Foundation Australia.</p> <p>This study plans to learn more about pulmonary fibrosis and determine if genetic factors contribute to the development of diseases which result in scarring in the lung. What we learn may be helpful in the future to people diagnosed with these diseases, known as pulmonary fibrosis, and their family members.</p>

Key inclusion criteria	<ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. Individuals with PF who have a family history of PF or ILD; or</li><li>2. Families with multiple people living with PF, including their unaffected relatives.</li></ol>
Key exclusion criteria	We require at least two affected relatives from a family to participate in order for their unaffected relatives to participate in the study. This will allow us to look for genetic similarities and differences between family members with and without PF.
Number of participants sought	20 well described families, family members with and without disease.
